Every answer carries the reason behind it. Read the reason for the questions you got right as well — that is where you find out whether you were right for the right reason.

A. Multiple choice

1. **A) am** — I always takes am. It is the only subject that does, which is what makes it easy to remember.
2. **B) is** — She is a singular third-person subject, so it takes is. Note that the job also needs the article a.
3. **C) are** — Parents is plural, and every plural subject takes are.
4. **D) Are** — You takes are, and be makes its own question by moving to the front. Do is never used with be.
5. **B) is** — Weather is a singular uncountable noun, so it takes is.
6. **C) are** — We takes are, and the negative is simply are + not. No auxiliary is needed.
7. **C) I am thirty years old.** — English gives age with be, not with have. Years old is the standard phrase; have thirty years is a direct translation from French, Spanish or Turkish.
8. **B) Is** — Your brother is one person, so the question begins with Is.
9. **D) are** — Children is an irregular plural, so it takes are — the missing -s does not make it singular.
10. **C) is** — Times, dates and the weather all use it plus is.

1. **is** — One sister, so is. The contraction she's would also be correct if the pronoun were used instead of the noun.
2. **am** — I takes am, always. Tired is an adjective, so a verb is required to join it to the subject.
3. **are** — They is plural, so it takes are.
4. **is** — Days of the week use it plus is — the it does not refer to anything in particular.
5. **are** — You always takes are, whether it means one person or several.
6. **are** — We takes are, and the negative simply adds not after it. Aren't would also be correct here.
7. **Is** — She is singular, and the question is made by putting be at the front. No do is used.
