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*Every answer carries the reason behind it. Read the reason for the questions you got right as well — that is where you find out whether you were right for the right reason.*

## A. Multiple choice

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1. **B) warmer** — Warm is a one-syllable adjective, so it takes -er.
2. **B) more difficult** — Difficult has three syllables, so it takes more.
3. **C) better** — Good is irregular and becomes better.
4. **A) worse** — Bad is irregular and becomes worse.
5. **C) further** — Far is irregular and becomes further or farther.
6. **B) easier** — Two-syllable adjectives ending in -y change the y to i and add -er.
7. **B) bigger** — A short vowel plus a single consonant doubles the consonant: big -> bigger.
8. **B) She is taller than me.** — The comparison word is than, and tall takes -er.
9. **B) as** — As ... as expresses equality between two things.
10. **A) as big** — The negative of the equality structure keeps the plain adjective between as and as.

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1. **older** — Old is a one-syllable adjective, so it takes -er.
2. **less** — Less is the opposite of more and reduces the quality.
3. **better** — Good is irregular and becomes better.
