1. **B) rains** — The if clause takes the present simple even though it refers to the future.
2. **B) will pass** — The result clause takes will plus the base verb.
3. **B) arrive** — When behaves exactly like if: the clause stays in the present.
4. **B) If it snows, we won't drive.** — Present simple after if, will in the main clause.
5. **B) leave** — Unless means if not, so the verb after it stays positive and present.
6. **B) will be** — The consequence of a real possibility takes will.
7. **B) will be** — The main clause takes will even when the if clause comes second.
8. **B) opens** — As soon as behaves like if and takes the present simple.
9. **A) might** — Might replaces will when the result is less certain.
10. **B) come** — Until takes the present simple in a future sentence.
